Living in the Oregon & SW Washington region

- Local history:
 - The history of the City of Portland, Oregon, began in 1843 when business partners William Overton and Asa Lovejoy filed to claim land on the west bank of the Willamette River in Oregon Country. In 1845 the name of Portland was chosen for this community by coin toss (the other proposed city name was Boston). On February 8, 1851, the city was incorporated. Portland has continued to grow in size and

population, with the 2020 population of 676,851 residents. Portland is Oregon's largest city, and is considered one of the top cities in the nation in terms of quality of life.

- Oregon was officially admitted to the union as a state on February 14th,
 1859. Oregon now has a population of 4,460,000.
- Vancouver is a city on the north bank of the Columbia River. Vancouver, is the oldest city in the state of Washington! Vancouver was founded in 1824 by fur traders from the Hudson's Bay Company, as part of Great Britain's effort to secure territory for Canada on the west coast of North America. This effort failed when what became the State of Washington was ceded to the United States in 1849. Congress approved the formation of Washington Territory in 1853, and in 1855 the Territorial Legislature formally changed the town's name from Columbia City to Vancouver. Under its new name it became one of the territory's first incorporated cities on January 23, 1857. Vancouver currently has a population of 187,615, making it the fourth-largest city in Washington state.
- In 1889, Washington became the 42nd state of the United States.
- The Portland Metropolitan Area consists of 3 counties in Oregon (Multnomah, Washington, and Clackamas) and 1 County (Clark) in Washington with a total 4 county population of 2,174,000.
- The Dartmouth Club of Oregon & SW Washington region consists of all of Oregon (population 4,460,000, and 7 counties in SW Washington (Clark (includes Vancouver), Klickitat, Cowlitz, Pacific, Lewis, Wahkiakum, and Skamania) with a current population of 659,000. The total Dartmouth region has a population of 5,119,000.

• The climate:

The region has a wide variety of climate: The valley between the Coast and Cascade mountain ranges has a fairly moderate weather pattern throughout the year. The Oregon and Washington coast has somewhat cooler temperatures expected of the the coast, and is a favorite vacation venue during the summer months. The Cascade mountains (to the east of the valley) has weather for a wide variety of year around outdoor activities skiing, hiking, rafting, camping, fishing, lake boating, and much more. The area east of the Cascades to the Idaho border is high mountain desert with its own unique outdoor activity options.

Business and industries:

 The region has a wide variety of business: technology, athletic equipment, apparel, wood products, agriculture, advertising, entertainment, engineering, financial services, health and science, manufacturing, etc.
