Partnering with the Class of 1982:

I am very pleased to announce that the Class of 1982 has decided to establish an endowment fund at the Dickey Center that will parallel our Great Issues Innovations Fund. Their goals will be very similar to ours, if not exactly the same. Their Treasurer approached me several years ago, asking if we, the class 25 years ahead of them, would be interested in collaborating on a project for the College. I suggested our Great Issues Fund which was in its infancy at that time. They've watched it grow to over \$500,000, observed the activities we've participated in with the Dickey Center and Dartmouth undergraduates, and decided to join in on the fun!

This collaborative approach is unique. It will provide 25 additional years of funding and endowment growth. Our partnering with the '82s will enable the Dickey Center to develop ever bigger and more creative projects to guide Dartmouth students toward an appreciation for, and desire to help resolve, future Great Issues. Our legacy gift to Dartmouth will thus be leveraged to a much larger total and have a major impact in this troubled world for years to come.

San Francisco – Friday evening – welcoming wine reception and dinner at picturesque location. Saturday – tour of Asian Art Museum led by docent Cinda, and other local activities.

Sunday – possible lunch and cruise on SF Bay, tours of other attractions.

Napa Valley – Monday – great luncheon possibilities and wine tasting opportunities on the way to St. Helena, followed on arrival by reception and dinner.

Tuesday – lunch and tour of Bohemian Grove on the Russian River near the coast.

Wednesday – winery visits and tastings followed by concluding dinner at *Casa Greene*.

Homecoming (October 26-28) - The football opponent is Harvard, and many plans are already in place. For those who can join us on Friday, the 26th, we're hoping to have lunch and a tour of the recently renovated Moosilauke Ravine Lodge, about a one-hour drive north of Hanover. More details to follow as the weekend approaches.

Tuscany, Italy (December 5-10) - This mini involves traveling with the Dartmouth Symphony Orchestra, led by Maestro Filippo Ciabatti, to Florence and nearby Lucca and Siena for a "premiere collaboration with the Orchestra Toscana dei Conservatori on a tour of the world-renowned conservatories of Tuscany." It is being organized by the Hopkins Center and will be open to major donors to the Hop in addition to classes with endowment funds like our Hopkins Travel Fund. The limit is 30 participants. The cost is high - \$8,500 per couple/\$5,750 per individual (not including air fare to/from Florence). To read about the trip, check the website – hop.dartmouth.edu. Registration will be on a first-come, first served basis.
