Tuesday – lunch and tour of Bohemian Grove on the Russian River near the coast. Wednesday – winery visits and tastings followed by concluding dinner at *Casa Greene*.

Homecoming (October 26-28) - The football opponent is Harvard, and many plans are already in place. For those who can join us on Friday, the 26th, we're hoping to have lunch and a tour of the recently renovated Moosilauke Ravine Lodge, about a one-hour drive north of Hanover. More details to follow as the weekend approaches.

Tuscany, Italy (December 5-10) - This mini involves traveling with the Dartmouth Symphony Orchestra, led by Maestro Filippo Ciabatti, to Florence and nearby Lucca and Siena for a "premiere collaboration with the Orchestra Toscana dei Conservatori on a tour of the world-renowned conservatories of Tuscany." It is being organized by the Hopkins Center and will be open to major donors to the Hop in addition to classes with endowment funds like our Hopkins Travel Fund. The limit is 30 participants.
